
## Eye for an Eye

But we need to understand the context in which those words were spoken by God. They were intended as a rule for the administration of justice in public courts or by appointed rulers. They were not intended as a license for personal retrobution. Jesus tells us to leave justice in the hands of God. If someone strikes you on the cheek, turn the other one to them. If someone asks you to carry their load for a mile, go two. I think you will find that life, like little kids sports, is a lot funner if you don't keep score.
